FINANCING YOUR PARTICIPATION IN THE EVENT

COSTS OF STAY

The costs of stay of your coming to the meeting should be financed from your Travel Costs, according to the rules given in the Guidelines for the Use of the Grant (please see: attached document Travel Distance and https://eacea.ec.europa.eu/sites/eacea-site/files/guidelines for the use of the grant cbhe 8.12.16.pdf).





In Financial Statement for reporting you need to calculate costs of stay in line with your boarding passes and/or number of days of your stay in Valencia. Maximum days for this visit are 5 (3 days for meeting sessions and 2 days for travel) or 5 x 120 EUR = 600 EUR for Costs of Stay, if you stay from 18th to 22nd of September or longer. For example, if someone stays in Valencia from 18th to 21st of September, that person can charge only 4 days; or if someone stays in Valencia from 18th to 23rd of September, that person can charge only 5 days, not more. The calculation is based on number of days of stay, not on numbers of nights in hotel.

ARRIVAL TO CITY OF VALENCIA

By airport Valencia

Valencia Airport in Manises (IATA: VLC), also known as Manises Airport, is the tenth-busiest Spanish airport in terms of passengers and second in the region after Alicante. It is situated 8 km west of the city of Valencia. The airport has flight connections to about 20 European countries and 5.79 million passengers passed through the airport in 2016.

By Metro (www.metrovalencia.es)

Two Underground lines link the airport with the city centre and the port.

Line 3: Rafelbunyol-Aeroport

Valencia Metrovalencia line 3 runs between the airport and the city centre, the university area and the north zone of the metropolitan area. The station is on the ground floor of the regional flights terminal.

Line 5: Aeroport-Marítim Serrería

Valencia Metrovalencia line 5 runs directly from the airport to the city centre and the port of Valencia. The station is on the ground floor of the regional flights terminal.

Metrovalencia has an information office at the airportarrivals zone.

By Bus (www.emtvalencia.es)

City bus route 150 (Metrobus) runs between the airport and Valencia city centre, with intermediate stops at Mislata, Quart de Poblet and Manises.

CITY OF VALENCIA

Valencia (Spanish: València), on the east coast of Spain, is the capital of the autonomous community of Valencia and the third-largest city in Spain after Madrid and Barcelona, with around 800,000 inhabitants in the administrative centre. Its urban area extends beyond the administrative city limits with a population of around 1.5–1.6 million people. Valencia is Spain's third largest metropolitan area, with a population ranging from 1.7 to 2.5 million depending on how the metropolitan area is defined. The Port of Valencia is the 5th busiest container port in Europe and the busiest container port on the Mediterranean Sea. The city is ranked at Gamma+ in the Globalization and World Cities Research Network. Valencia is integrated into an industrial area on the Costa del Azahar (Orange Blossom Coast).

Valencia was founded as a Roman colony by the consul Decimus Junius Brutus Callaicus in 138 BC, and called Valentia Edetanorum. In 714 Moroccan and Arab Moors occupied the city, introducing their language, religion and customs; they implemented improved irrigation systems and the cultivation of new crops as well, being capital of the Taifa of Valencia. In 1238 the Christian king James I of Aragon conquered the city and divided the land among the nobles who helped him conquer it, as witnessed in the Llibre del Repartiment. He also created a new law for the city, the Furs of Valencia, which were extended to the rest of the Kingdom of Valencia. In the 18th century Philip V of Spain abolished the privileges as punishment to the kingdom of Valencia for aligning with the Habsburg side in the War of the Spanish Succession. Valencia was the capital of Spain when Joseph Bonaparte moved the Court there in the summer of 1812. It also served as capital between 1936 and 1937, during the Second Spanish Republic.

The city is situated on the banks of the Turia, on the east coast of the Iberian Peninsula, fronting the Gulf of Valencia on the Mediterranean Sea. Its historic centre is one of the largest in Spain, with approximately 169 ha (420 acres); this heritage of ancient monuments, views and cultural attractions makes Valencia one of the country's most popular tourist destinations.

Due to its long history, this is a city with numerous popular celebrations and traditions, such as the Fallas (featuring the traditional Spanish dish paella), which were declared as Fiestas of National Tourist Interest of Spain in 1965[5] and Intangible cultural heritage by UNESCO in November 2016. From 1991 to 2015, Rita Barberá Nolla was the mayor of the city, yet in 2015, Joan Ribó from Coalició Compromís, became mayor.

The Polytechnic University of Valencia (Valencian: Universitat Politècnica de València, UPV; IPA: [universi tat poli tennika de va lensia], Spanish: Universidad Politécnica de Valencia) is a Spanish university located in Valencia, with a focus on science and technology. It was founded in 1968 as the Higher Polytechnic School of Valencia and became a university in 1971, but some of its schools are more than 100 years old.

The Universitat Politècnica de València consists of three campuses: (Valencia, Gandia and Alcoy) and 14 schools and faculties: Faculty of Business Administration and Management, Faculty of Fine Arts, Higher Polytechnic School of Alcoy, Higher Polytechnic School of Gandia, School of Agricultural Engineering, School of Computer Science, School of Architecture, School of Building Management, School of Civil Engineering, School of Design Engineering, School of Engineering in Geodesy, School of Cartography and Surveying, School of Industrial Engineering, School of Rural Environments and Enology, and School of Telecommunications Engineering.

The university offers 48 bachelor's and master's degrees, and 81 doctoral degrees.





